FERAL CAT COALITION OF OREGON	Ú	FCCO serves Western OR and SW WA. Trap, neuter, and return (TNR) of stray & feral cats. Caregivers trap and bring cats to clinic, then return with a commitment to continue caring for the cats on a permanent basis. \$10-\$30 donation requested but no one turned away for lack of funds! Low-Income Only Programs

SPAY & SAVE	1	Serves residents of Portland metro areas including Multnomah, Washington, Clackamas, County, OR and Clark County, WA who receive one or more of the following forms of assistance: Food Stamps (SNAP), SSI, Section 8/Public Housing, TANF, WIC, Medicaid/Oregon Health Plan, and reduced cost or free school lunch programs. Those living on a low-income in the service area but do not receive aid, may also qualify, but may pay a slightly higher co-pay.	(800) 345-SPAY www.asapmetro.org
PAW TEAM	4 m	Paw Team partners with clinics in the community, including the Multnomah County Animal Services shelter clinic. Wait times can be several months due to high demand.	(971) 333- 0729 www.pawteam.org
PEOPLE UNITED FOR ANIMALS	4 %	PUFA provides vouchers for both dogs and cats to people in Oregon and Washington with proof of government assistance, including types not accepted by other program such as Social Security Disability, Veteran's Benefits and Energy Assistance. Client pays \$15 per cat and \$25 per dog and must also pay for required rabies vaccinations at the six participating clinics. All contact is online no phone service is available. JUSTICE FOR ANIMAL WELFARE SOCIETY	1 m	For those in Clark County, Washington only: JAWS provides a sliding fee co-pay for spay/neuter surgery with a focus on dogs for those who typically do not qualify for the above listed programs.	(360) 887-0450 www.jawsspayneuter.org
HOMEWARD BOUND PETS	ú	For low-income owners and caretakers <i>in Yamhill County only.</i> Once a month, we load up between 25 to 40 cats (pets, strays and ferals) that have been registered through our appointment line. The fee for spay/neuter is \$30.00, but our motto is 'no cat turned away'. "BEAT THE HEAT for TOM AND MOM"	4	Program offered through Oregon Spay/Neuter Fund. Very low cost program (\$20 spay / \$10 neuter) for cats only, spaces extremely limited in Portland metro, Salem and Oregon Coast.
